

Contract Clause. The Contract Clause appears in the United States Constitution, Article I, section 10, clause 1. The clause prohibits a State from passing any law that “impairs the obligation of contracts”. Treaties, Alliances, or - Bills of credit - Legal tender - Impairing the obligation of. The clause is found in Article I of the United States Constitution. Generally speaking, this clause was added to the Constitution in order to prohibit states from interfering with private contracts. The clause states that, 'No State shall pass any Law impairing the Obligation of Contracts '.
